
Message from the Minister


Also it means an ideology that emphasizes loyalty, devotion to a nation and holds that such obligations outweigh other individual's interest.





With the implementation of the first five-year plan in 1961, the country experienced rapid economic growth. Modernization occurred at the same time that the country joined international organizations such as the United Nations in 1971 and established diplomatic relations with other countries.

Bhutan was noted in the 1990s for its unique and holistic development model, Gross National Happiness, which our Great Fourth King pioneered. Bhutan considers the happiness of its people to be more important than the country's gross domestic product. As a result, succeeding governments have focused on creating conditions that maximize people's happiness. On July 18, 2008, another historic occurrence occurred. Bhutan is a democratic constitutional monarchy that is one of the world's newest democracies. Because of His Majesty the Fourth King and His Majesty the King's skillful leadership, the transition to a democratic nation has been successful.



Bhutan has reached the point when it needs to diversify its economic basis. Small and cottage industries, agriculture, and mining are only a few of the potential sectors for achieving the twin goals of economic expansion (self-reliance) and full employment.

Bhutan is considered as the GNH's motherland. The world has realized that happiness is important. Bhutan should endeavor to improve the conditions that are necessary for people to be happy. Economic stability (money - having a steady source of income), health, family integrity, gender equality, and equality are all regarded determinants of happiness, according to the GHN surveys. Bhutan First - in order to promote Bhutan as a GNH society, policy interventions and programs should be implemented to enable the drivers to achieve gross national happiness.

Overall, national interest - Bhutan first - should take precedence. All other pursuits should take a back seat. A person's, a community's, a Gewog's, a Dzongkhag's, or an organization's interest in Bhutan becoming self-reliant, reinforced as a GNH society, maintaining our sovereign position, and moving ahead of the countries.






In Bhutan, because of our compassionate king, we Bhutanese have freedom wherever we go. Moreover, the education and health facilities are free.

Gongsa Ugyen Wangchuck became the 1st hereditary king of Bhutan on December 17, 1907. In 1905, he was made the 'Knight Commander of Order of the Star of Indian'. The second king, Druk Gyalpo Jigme Wangchuck implemented administrative reforms within the country. During the time of third Druk Gyalpo Jigme Dorji Wangchuck, Bhutan became a member of the United Nations and made the country a part of the global diplomatic circle. At the age of 16, due to the untimely demise of the third king, the crown prince Jigme Singye Wangchuck became the youngest monarch in the world. And he created the internationally known philosophy "Gross National Happiness." The fifth Druk Gyalpo Gongsa Jigme Khesar Namgyal Wangchuk set up a modern judicial system and the first council of ministers in Bhutan.

The essence of the philosophy of Gross National Happiness is the peace and happiness of our people and security and sovereignty of the nation', as said by the 5th Druk Gyalpo. The fourth Druk Gyalpo announced that Gross National Happiness is more important than gross domestic product. Gross National Happiness as a vision of human development, a balance between material and spiritual development. In 2008 when the constitutional monarchy started the constitution of Bhutan (2008, article 9) directed the states "To promote those conditions that will enable the pursuit of Gross National Happiness. Gross Domestic product is the total monetary or market value of all the finished goods and services produced within a country's border in a specific time period. Whereas Gross National Happiness is a philosophy that guides the government of Bhutan. It includes an index which is used to measure the collective happiness and wellbeing of a population.
